
Rick Hackman flew his usual assortment of rather unique homebrews, most of which actually worked. The XR-76 and -77A looked like new ones.

# TO SET A CLUB RECORD:

A club performance record may be set or broken at any SPAAR Sport Launch or contest. Simply make a notation on your Flight Card that you wish the flight to be considered for a club record. If it is a duration event, it is the flyer's responsibility to see that the flight is timed. Altitude events are obviously restricted to those launches that the club altitude tracking equipment is available.

Please keep in mind that your model doesn't have to be a super high-tech competition model in order for you to set a club record. For that matter, some of the events that we keep performance records for are not recognized NAR events. Some examples are E, F and G Parachute Duration. We do it "just for fun"....which, the last time I checked, was the whole reason for flying rockets anyway! Some of these records are getting pretty old, and are screaming to be broken. Let's take a shot at them in '96!


